News from Peter and Sue

Sue and I are now in Wellington, having travelled from Auckland on an amazing twelve hour train journey. When we arrived the city was buzzing with rugby supporters all in fancy dress - we were in the middle of a two day international rugby 'sevens' tournament. England made the semi-final, but were beaten by New Zealand (again). Folk are keen on their rugby here!

We are staying with Bruce and Glenda Anderson - very generous hosts. Bruce is the Superintendent of the Wellington Methodist Parish. The weather isn't as good here; Saturday proved to be cloudy with occasional drizzle, but we aren't having the winds that are a feature of life here.

Wellington is an interesting place and the capital of the country. Today has been a national holiday for Waitangi Day - a celebration of the treaty signed between Moari tribal leaders and Britain. Here in Wellington, we enjoyed a Festival on the quayside with lots of cultural displays of dance and song from the various cultural groups.

On Sunday morning it was a real privilege to be present for the induction of a new Tongan minister for one of the four congregations of the Methodist Church here. On the first Sunday of each month the four congregations (Tongan, Samoan, Fijian and English speaking) come together for a united service and this month the service included the annual Covenant Service, Communion and the induction. Various choirs took part, the Bible was read in two different languages and the Tongan congregation brought their brass band along too. When the new minister was inducted other ministers were asked to come and lay hands on him during a commissioning prayer. I was asked to join in at this point - it was a very moving experience. All in all, it was a joyful occasion lasting a full two hours and then followed by a feast provided by members of the Tongan congregation - that too was splendid.

We are very much looking forward to the rest of our time here. On Wednesday we are due to meet with the City Council Mayor to present a plaque from our own Town Council as a greeting from one Wellington to another. Later in the week I should be meeting with a local Rotary Club to present a pennant from the Club in our Wellington.

We'll send another update later in the month. In the meantime, we send our love and continue to keep you in mind and prayer, especially as we hear news from you whilst we are away.
